

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
For  
Air Quality Operating Permit  
for Eunice North Compressor Station of Versado Gas Processors, LLC

Versado Gas Processors, LLC at 6 Desta Drive Suite 3300; Midland, TX 79705 has submitted an air quality operating permit application to the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality operating permit for its Eunice North Compressor Station. The owner of this plant is Versado Gas Processors, LLC. The exact location of the facility is/will be at latitude 35 deg, 40 min, 42.03 sec and longitude -103 deg, 5 min, 28.55 sec. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is located approximately 0.5 mile northwest of Eunice in Lea County, New Mexico. This application file has been assigned an Operating Permit Number P082R1M1 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 602.

The main purpose of the plant is to compress natural gas that is sent via pipeline to Eunice Gas Processing Plant.

This operating permit application is for a Significant Modification. Per 20.2.70.401.C.(4) NMAC, this permitting action involves retiring Compressor Engine C-37, adding compressor engine C-41 which will be equipped with a catalytic convertor, and reinstating an additional backup generator G-7.

The emissions, as established in NSR Permit 0057-M4, and brought forward into this permit are as follows. Parentheses note changes in emissions from previous operating permit action – P082-R1; emissions are expressed in tons per year (tpy). Nitrogen Oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) at 1416.6 tpy (-110.5); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 280.9 tpy (-3); Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 88.7 tpy (-5.4);

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. This review included evaluation of the emission rates and applicable requirements to determine compliance status.

The NMED has made a preliminary determination that this plant will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 3, 7, 61, 70, 71, 72, 73, 77 and 82; 40 CFR 50; 40 CFR 60 Subparts JJJJ; 40 CFR 63 Subparts ZZZZ; and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality operating permit on or before October 10, 2011.

Interested persons may obtain the draft operating permit, submit written comments, or request a public hearing on Operating Permit Number P082R1M1. Contact the New Mexico Environment Department, Air Quality Bureau, Operating Permit Unit, 1301 Siler Rd, Bldg B, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87507-3113.

Written requests for public hearing must state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. Comments must be based on the requirements of the applicable state and

federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. Comments or hearing requests must be received within 30 days after the public notice is published.
