Preliminary Determination for an Air Quality Permit for

Williams Four Corners, LLC

Williams Four Corners, LLC 188 County Road 4900, Bloomfield, NM 87413 has submitted an air quality permit application to the Air Quality Bureau (AQB), New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) for an air quality permit to revise the permit for the 32-8#3 CDP Compressor Station. The application file has been assigned Permit No. 1034-M5 and TEMPO Agency Interest ID No. 1168. The exact location of the facility is at latitude 36 deg, 54 min, 53 sec and longitude -107 deg, 40 min, 27 sec. To aid in locating this facility, the approximate location is 18 miles northeast of Aztec and approximately 100 yards west, northwest from the intersection of Hwy 511 and County Road 4600 in San Juan County, New Mexico.

The proposed permit revision for this natural gas compressor station will consist of permitting existing VOC emissions due to natural gas blowdowns caused by start ups, shut downs, and maintenance activities and permitting no more than 10 tpy of VOC emissions due to malfunctions.

Total air pollutant emissions to the atmosphere are estimated to be approximately Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) at 119.0 tons per year (tpy); Carbon Monoxide (CO) at 210.4 tpy; Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) at 132.2 tpy; Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) at 0.17 tpy; Total Suspended Particulate Matter (TSP) at 2.8 tpy, Particulate Matter 10 microns or less (PM₁₀) at 2.8 tpy, and Particulate Matter 2.5 microns or less (PM_{2.5}) at 2.8 tpy. These emission estimates could change slightly during the course of the Department's review of the application.

The NMED has conducted a preliminary review of the information submitted with the permit application. The preliminary review and applicant's dispersion modeling analysis submitted with previous permit applications indicates that the facility's air emissions will meet the ambient air quality standards for NO_x, and CO. Dispersion modeling is not required for VOCs. A full review will evaluate the estimated emission rates to determine compliance with ambient air standards.

Based on the applicant's analysis, a preliminary determination is that this facility will comply with the requirements of Title 20, New Mexico Administrative Code (NMAC), Chapter 2, Parts 7 and 72 and the New Mexico Air Quality Control Act. Therefore, the preliminary intent of NMED is to issue the air quality permit on or before October 17, 2011.

To ensure compliance with state and federal air regulations, the permit is expected to include conditions that limit the emissions and conditions that will require monitoring, record keeping and reporting to the Department.

The permit application is available for review in electronic or hard copy at the Air Quality Bureau Office, 1301 Siler Road, Building B, Santa Fe, New Mexico. The permit application is also available at the NMED Farmington Field Office located at 3400 Messina, Suite 5000, Farmington, NM 87402 for public review.

All interested persons have 30 days from the date this notice is published to notify the Department in writing of their interest in the permit application. The written comments should refer to the company name, site name and Permit No. (or send a copy of this notice along with your comments). The written

comments must state the nature of the issues raised and how it relates to the requirements of applicable state and federal air quality regulations and the Clean Air Act. The written comments should be mailed to Cember Hardison, New Mexico Environment Dept., Air Quality Bureau, Permit Section, 1301 Siler Road, Building B, Santa Fe, New Mexico 87507-3113.

The Department will notify all persons who have provided written comments as to when and where the Department's analysis may be reviewed. Although all written comments will be made part of the public record, any person who does not express interest in writing before the end of this first 30 day period will not receive such notification.

If the Department receives written public comment before the end of the Department's 30 day public notice, the Department's analysis will be made available for review for 30 days at the NMED Farmington field office nearest to the source before the permit will be issued. Written comments on the analysis or permit application may be submitted to the Department, attention Cember Hardison, during this second 30 day period or at any time before the permit is issued or denied.
