KUDOS FOR THE NM OPERATOR CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

The Associated Boards of Certification (ABC) named NMED's Operator Certification Program **"Operator Certification Program of the Year"** for 2007. ABC announced the award at its annual conference on Jan. 17, 2008. The program was selected by the department's peers in operator certification based on the successful implementation of a database project that streamlined program operations, innovations in online access to certification records for operators, improvements in study guides, customer service, program efficiency, and recent updates to state laws and regulations.

"The proper operation of water and wastewater systems by qualified operators is necessary to protect public health, the quality of New Mexico's ground and surface waters, and the state's enormous capital investment in water and wastewater utility infrastructure," said NMED Secretary Ron Curry. "NMED's Surface and Drinking Water Bureaus worked hard to develop

a database that provides a wide variety of information regarding water and wastewater system operations."

All Public Water and Wastewater Systems are required by state regulation to be operated by a certified operator. The department's Operator Certification Program certifies operators as professionals to maintain and operate the many complex aspects of water and wastewater systems.

ABC has been assisting states and provinces with environmental certification programs since 1972. Membership consists of over 90 certifying authorities representing more than 40 states and 10 Canadian provinces which certify over 150,000 water and wastewater operators.

NEW MEXICO UTILITY OPERATOR CERTIFICATION ADVISORY BOARD GOES TO PUBLIC HEARING

It's been a long and winding road, but the NM Water Quality Control Commission granted, on Tuesday, November 11, 2007, the NM Utility Operator Advisory Board a Public Hearing to be held on March 11, 2008. The hearing will be to adopt the proposed regulations covering the Minimum # of Operators at public water and wastewater facilities.

In May of 2006, the NM Advisory Board was tasked by the Commission to develop and propose criteria for determining the **minimum** number of operators a treatment facility must have while a facility is being operated. The NMUOC Advisory Board conducted 7 public board meetings and 2 public forums in drafting the criteria. These meetings (which I might add, had record attendance) were attended by stakeholders interested in the drafting of the regulations. The Stakeholders included representatives of organizations such as the NM Municipal League, NM Rural Water, OMI of Rio Rancho, water/wastewater operators, and individual municipalities such as the City of Bloomfield, Red River, and several others.

The Advisory Board is proposing criteria that will assist the NMED and Public treatment facilities in determining the minimum number of operators needed to operate the systems. There are several reasons for the new regulations that date back 4 to 5 years.

To begin with, the Board has identified that millions of State and Federal dollars are spent each year on water and wastewater infrastructure projects in New Mexico, and the responsibility of certified and non-certified operators is to protect those investments through maintenance, and operating programs.

The Advisory Board also recognized that the current regulations do not contain criteria that require more than one operator to operate any facility regardless of the size or complexity of the system. The Board stated that, "for many of the systems in New Mexico, it would be impossible for just **one** Certified Operator at the appropriate level of certification, to have the ability to oversee all the operations that occur in treatment facilities of any substantial size." Therefore, the criteria is intended to assist facility designers, NMED and public facilities to identify how many operators would be necessary to safely and properly operate treatment systems in New Mexico.

The proposed regulations also include language that will allow facilities to request an adjustment of the Minimum Number of operators required at their facility, by petition through the Department. This language is intended to take into account modern technologies, operation plans, and automated systems to help determine the minimum number of operator's necessary. Many of the Small Systems, (fewer

than 500 population served) should not see any change to their current requirements. Small systems are required, under the current regulations, to have a certified operator at the appropriate level.

The UOC Advisory Board has put an enormous amount time and effort into drafting this regulation, if you get a chance, thank these people for a job well done. Chairman Ken Mosley is still taking comments and questions @ kenmosley@ruidoso-nm.gov.

WATER SAMPLER CERTIFICATION AVAILABLE

The Operator Certification Program introduced two new certifications in January 2008. Testing for Water Sampling Technician 1 and 2 will be available at all NMED Certification Examination Sessions.

Many questions have been asked about the new Certifications. Here are some of the most frequently asked questions and answers:

- I take bacteriological samples for a small public water system, what level of Certification do I need?
ANSWER: Water Sampling Technician 1
- Who needs the Water Sampling Technician 2 certifications?
ANSWER: NMED samplers, and anyone who collects Chemical and Radiological samples on Federal Facilities.
- How long do we have to get the sampling certificates, before enforcement actions are taken?
ANSWER: Since the examinations became available in January 2008, the Department will not take any action until January 2009.
- I have a Water Systems Level 2 certification; Do I need the sampling certification?
ANSWER: NO, the WS2 incorporates both levels of the sampling certification.
- I have a Water Systems Level 1 certification; Do I need the sampling certification?
ANSWER: If you are just taking bacteriological samples, then NO, your Level 1 is sufficient. But if you are taking Chemical/Radiological samples, then YES, you will need to take the WST2 examination.

The ballots were counted at the Executive Board meeting in Las Cruces and the Constitution revisions were passed but a typo was found. Here is what was sent out with the typo underlined; and then the corrected version.

ARTICLE 6. EXECUTIVE BOARD

6.1 All major decisions on Association action and policy must be made by the Executive Board. This Board may delegate the administration of its policy to the elected officers or to committees assigned to particular tasks. (Executive Board decisions can only be made by the active membership (as described in Article 1 of the By-Laws).

Changed to:

ARTICLE 6. EXECUTIVE BOARD

6.1 All major decisions on Association action and policy must be made by the Executive Board. This Board may delegate the administration of its policy to the elected officers or to committees assigned to particular tasks. (Executive Board decisions can only be over-ruled by the active membership) (as described in Article 1 of the By-Laws).

This new revised Constitution will be made available on the web site in its entirety.
